Introducing Meithrin/Nursery

Children are generally admitted to our Nursery in the September prior to their 4th Birthday. The Nursery is open for two sessions each day with 40 places in the morning and afternoon:

Morning Nursery 9 am - 11.30 am / Afternoon Nursery 12.45 – 3.15pm

Both sessions are identical, are of the same length of time and provide the same opportunities. As far as possible, parents are given the choice of which session they wish their child to attend. If one session is full a place at the alternative session is offered.

Our Nursery is located adjacent to the Reception classes and is an integral part of our Early Years unit. The Nursery itself is a large area with its own entrance and toilet facilities. It is very well equipped, with opportunities to develop all aspects of learning both indoors and out. An extended outside play area, an interactive whiteboard, iPads, computer suite and sensory room make our Nursery one of the best equipped in the City.

Shortly before your child is due to start Nursery you will be invited to bring your child for a pre - Nursery visit to meet the Nursery staff and join in the activities. An Open Evening, with an opportunity to speak to the Nursery Staff or the Headteacher is also part of our 'Getting to Know You and Your Child' policy.

Entry is staggered to allow children to settle and parents and staff to get to know each other.

In the case of persistent anti-social behaviour the Headteacher will contact the parents.

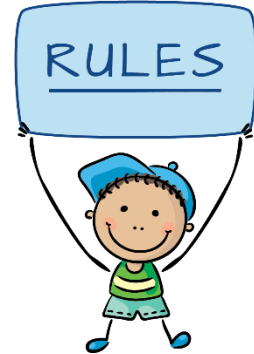
In Nursery, we:

- Provide a secure, welcoming and happy atmosphere where children experience a variety of activities and the opportunity to participate in purposeful structured and spontaneous play.
- Stimulate and challenge all our children with care and sensitivity.
- Provide first hand experiences that are appropriate to individual stages of development, both indoors and out.
- Encourage children to make their own decision and choices to enable them to become independent learners.
- Provide a stimulating environment in which your child can acquire a variety of early skills.
- Introduce the children to the routine of school life and the six Areas of Learning and Experience: Expressive arts; Health and well-being; Humanities; Languages, literacy and communication; Mathematics and Numeracy; and Science and Technology
- Prepare your child for confident entry into Reception
- Develop a partnership between home and school to extend and enrich the experiences your child has received at home.

At all stages in the Nursery we encourage the children to be independent in their learning, both indoors and out. We look forward to welcoming your child to our Nursery.

Nursery Rules

- Listen carefully.
- Try your best to complete your tasks.
- Be kind to other children, staff and adults.
- Take turns and share with others
- Take care of Nursery toys and equipment
- Walk quietly inside the school building
- Help keep the Nursery tidy



Foundation Phase Curriculum

The learning experiences are presented in cross curricular topics. A new topic is covered each half term. An interactive Helping at Home document will be available via the Nursery Google Classroom each half term with information relating to the topic and how the children can be helped at home:

School Uniform

The majority of our children wear school uniform. School colours are red and grey, with a green t-shirt. The school sweatshirt and t-shirt can be ordered using the form available on the school website. Many of the activities in Nursery are messy, but aprons will always be provided. The provider is YC Sports, 5 Penlline Road, Whitchurch or 90 Crwys Road, Cathays.



Parking

There are no facilities within the school grounds for parental parking. We respectfully request that when parking on the roads around the school that care is taken not to obstruct residents' driveways, the school gates and restricted areas.

School Access

Following the upgrade of the outside entrances/gates, we have now installed a secure entry system on all external doors. If you require entry to the school building it must be via the front office as access via any of the other external doors is not possible.

The gate to allow access to the Nursery building will be opened automatically, and closes at 9.15 am.

The gate then reopens from 11.25 am –11.50 am for morning Nursery collection.

For afternoon Nursery, the gate is open from 12.55 pm -13.15 pm and then reopens at 3.20 pm.

If your child is late for Nursery, please take them to the main office at the front of the building where a member of staff will be called to meet them and take them to Nursery.

First Day in Nursery

The first day in Nursery is an important event in a child's life as well as in the lives of the parents. We try to make this day as happy as possible. It helps your child if you arrive on time and leave cheerfully.

When you bring your child to Nursery, you will be greeted by members of the Nursery Team who will show the children a coat peg and a name tag for to use each day as part of the self registration process.

Most of our children are happy about coming to Nursery and parents can leave fairly quickly. If your child is apprehensive or upset, they will receive support from the Nursery Team.

Settling into Nursery

Please ensure that your child arrives on time every day. Your child will miss valuable instructions if he/she is late as the Nursery teacher will have begun the first activity. This can also cause embarrassment to the child.

If you are late, please take your child to the school office, as the outer doors are closed for your child's safety. Lateness is regarded as an unauthorised absence and you will need to sign your child in on arrival.

Any unexplained absence is reported as unauthorised. Holidays in term time are unauthorised unless there are exceptional circumstances.



Day to Day Support

It would be most helpful if you could:

- Ensure your child can go to the toilet with minimal assistance
- Teach your child to flush the toilet and wash/dry their hands
- Label all coats and removable clothing clearly
- Help your child to recognise his/her name on the coat peg
- Encourage your child to dress/undress with the minimum of help
- Ensure that your child does not bring snacks, a drink, toys or a bag to Nursery
- Ensure that your child has warm clothes in colder months, and is well protected from the sun in Summer. Outdoor play is an important part of your child's development.

An Open Door

Parents are always welcome, but it is best to arrange a mutually convenient time to see the Headteacher or staff about specific problems or queries. Staff are available for a brief 'chat' at the end of the session as the start of the session is a busy time settling the children and beginning the first activity. The Nursery staff and Headteacher are always willing to answer your questions and try and resolve any problems.

Please inform the Nursery teacher of any situations at home that may affect your child in school e.g. family bereavement, parent admitted to hospital.

Your child's progress will be assessed throughout the Foundation Phase. Parents are invited to discuss their child's progress at two Parents Evenings in the Autumn and Spring terms. A written report identifying progress in the six Areas of Learning and Experience will be provided at the end of the Summer term.

Nursery Events

You will be notified of Nursery events via 'Schoop', an electronic communication system. An updated calendar of events will be available on our website. Our school Twitter account (@RhiwbeinaPrm) is updated regularly, with a snapshot of life at Rhiwbeina Primary School.

Information from Parents

Medical Information

We need to know if your child has any medical conditions or allergies. Children suffering from asthma should have their medication in school if required. There is a consent form to complete if your child requires any form of medication in school. Please download this from the website or ask at the school office.

Please note, no medication can be given without written consent.

For the health and wellbeing of children and staff, please keep your child at home if he/she is unwell. Poorly children do not concentrate, are lethargic and easily upset. Infections spread quickly in a school environment. Following vomiting and diarrhoea, your child must remain at home for 48 hours to stop the spread of infection.

Contact Details

We need to know how to contact you in an emergency. Please provide telephone numbers of at least two contacts. Please remember to notify us if any of the contact details change.

End of Nursery Collection

Access to the school is closely monitored and all doors are operated with a security key. If you need to pick up your child from school during the school day, please contact the school administrator in the main office.

Please ensure your child is collected on time at the end of their Nursery session. If you are going to be unavoidably late, please telephone the school and let us know. It is important to inform staff if someone other than yourself will be collecting your child. We will not allow children to leave with someone else unless we have already been informed.

No children in Nursery will be allowed to leave without a known adult.

Moving to Reception



Your child will move to Reception in the September preceding his/her 5th Birthday.

During the latter part of the Summer term, your child will have opportunities to meet his/her new teacher and spend some time in their new classroom.

The Foundation Phase staff are a highly effective team. The staff work closely together and all the relevant information regarding your child's progress and wellbeing whilst in Nursery will be shared with their Reception class teacher to ensure continuity in the next stage of his/her education.
